Why shave for a cure?

Eight Kiwis – adults and children – are diagnosed with blood cancer each day in New Zealand.

You might know someone going through blood cancer right now – some of those cancers include leukaemia, lymphoma and myeloma. It can be a really difficult and painful thing to go through.

And, often when people go through blood cancer, they lose their hair through chemotherapy treatment.

This can be a really upsetting experience. Many patients might feel really alone. But, you can show that you're there for them, by Shaving for a Cure.

What happens to the money raised?

Shave for a Cure is a fundraiser for Leukaemia & Blood Cancer NZ (LBC) – New Zealand's national charity dedicated to supporting patients, and their families/ whānau, living with a blood cancer or a serious blood condition.

The funds raised by Shave for a Cure will go toward LBC's work in patient support and advocacy, information and raising awareness and investing in life-saving cancer research.
